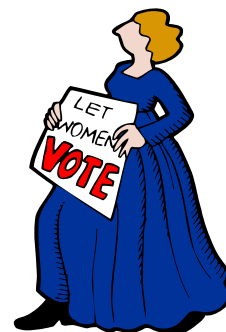

From the Preface –

“Throughout the suffrage struggle, America’s history, her principles, her traditions stood forth to indicate the inevitability of woman suffrage, to suggest that she would normally be the first country in the world to give the vote to women. Yet the years went by, decade followed decade, and twenty-six other countries gave the vote to their women while America delayed.

“Why the delay? ... it was the control of public sentiment, the deflecting and the thwarting of public sentiment, through the trading and the trickery, the buying and the selling of American politics. We think that we can prove it. Suffragists consider that they have a case against certain combines of interest that systematically fought suffrage with politics and effectively delayed suffrage for years. We think that we can make that case” (viii).

Catt and Rogers’s *Woman Suffrage and Politics: The Inner Story of the Suffrage Movement* is an important historical work which discusses the deterring influence of “the American political machine” on the women’s movement to secure the right to vote.

While the campaign for women’s suffrage in America had finally succeeded by the time of their work’s original publication, the extraordinary number of obstacles that arose during the process alerted women to the fact that the nation alleging to have the most open democratic process had, in fact, impeded them every step of the way in their efforts to have a say in their nation’s elections.

The authors gathered much of their information using the archives of the National American Woman Suffrage Association, collecting reports from 1848 to 1922 and stating how, “the facts and deductions drawn from them, and here assembled, should prove of significance to the advocates, perhaps especially the woman advocates, of each recurring struggle in the evolution of democracy” (ix).
