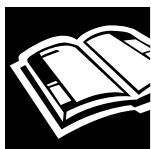

There are literally hundreds of books, pamphlets, and articles which seek to help non-lawyers help themselves. This revised Third Edition can help overcome the dilemma faced by the non-lawyer in determining which of these sources is best suited for their particular need.

This edition of the book builds upon the first two and is invaluable to any acquisitions librarian in helping to determine the best self-help books on the market for the non-lawyer. In the Introduction to the Third Edition, Diane Murley explains that titles included consist of those published between 1998 and July 31, 2005, along with some due to be released in 2006, though some older items remain because of their continued value.

Two types of resources are new to the Third Edition: Web sites and State Government Documents. In 1991 and 1997, very little self-help law and government information was accessible on the Web. Today, federal and state governments, along with other organizations, have begun making more information available to the public through their Web sites.

The Librarian's Copyright Companion provides a framework that will help librarians analyze the effects of copyright law in their library. It offers an in-depth discussion of the provisions of the U.S. Copyright Act most important to librarians — fair use (section 107), the library exemption (section 108), and the public performance exemption (section 110) — as well as chapters on audiovisual works, digital information, and licensing issues.

Author James S. Heller provides background on both international treaties and U.S. copyright law, reviewing court decisions that interpret the 1976 Copyright Act and its amendments. Appendices include Congressional and library association guidelines and model policies, a bibliography of pertinent literature and useful websites, selected provisions from the U.S. Copyright Act, and questions and answers on copyright for librarians.
