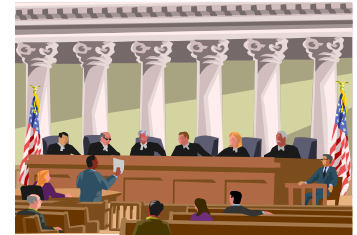

Established by the Peace Treaty of Versailles and other treaties at the conclusion of World War I, the Mixed Arbitral Tribunals constituted a revolutionary means of international arbitration. For the first time ever, these special tribunals were empowered to decide the claims of individuals against governments and settle disputes between governments. Their jurisdiction was greater than that of any previous international commission. With no historical precedent, the Mixed Arbitral Tribunals blazed a trail that left an indelible impact on global post-war international relations. The Editor-in Chief of this 10-volume set, Gilbert Gidel, was an esteemed Professor at the Faculty of Law of the University of Paris and the Free School of Political Sciences and was acclaimed as a leading French authority of his time.

The Mixed Arbitral Tribunals delivered more judgments than any other tribunal in modern times, with over 20,000 decisions alone being handed down in the Franco-German Arbitral Tribunal, followed by the Anglo-German and German-Italian tribunals, each with about 10,000 decisions. “...The Recueil contains also the rules of procedure of the different tribunals, national legislation on the questions involved, as well as pertinent decisions of domestic courts, bibliographical notes and tables.” —UN: 48-49. LEAGUE OF NATIONS OFFICIAL JOURNAL

Forerunner to the United Nations, the League of Nations was conceived during World War I to find a means to settle crises peacefully, prevent wars, and codify rules of warfare. It was established in 1919 under the Treaty of Versailles. Published from 1920-1940, the *League of Nations Official Journal* contains the complete minutes of the Sessions of the Council of the League from the 16th session onward, including the text of reports and resolutions as well as the principal documents received or dispatched by the Secretariat. The *Official Journal* also encompasses "Special supplements" that incorporated the records of the Assembly and of its Committees.
