Hein is pleased to offer the second edition of this outstanding casebook on national security law that will be of great interest and relevance to legal researchers and those concerned with the issues of national security in today's uncertain political and social environment.

The cases presented and analyzed slant with an eye to their impact on US policy and have evolved from some of the most dramatic events of the twentieth century, including the Japanese exclusion in World War II, the prosecution of the Rosenbergs and Wen Ho Lee, the publication of the Pentagon Papers, the investigation of the first bombing of the World Trade Center and the Landmarks case, the trials of Manuel Noriega, Oliver North and Timothy McVeigh, the War Powers Act and Congress' attempts to use the courts to stop the wars in Vietnam, Yugoslavia and Iraq. This edition also includes the critical issues of the last five years with notes and cases related to the USA Patriot Act, the Foreign Intelligence Surveillance Act, NSA surveillance, the Military Commissions Act, Guantanamo, coercive interrogation and the designation and rights of enemy combatants.

This new edition is clearly organized with chapters on the national security offenses of treason, espionage, terrorism and the export of sensitive and classified technology. These chapters are followed by sections on the government's powers in an emergency, (with discussions regarding martial law, posse comitatus, habeas corpus, military tribunals and the President's authority in a crisis.

The third section examines the tools used by the government in national security operations, including electronic surveillance, search and seizure, extradition and forcible rendition and the use of classified information in the courtroom. The final chapters are devoted to a review of the historical tension between the Executive and Legislative branches on exercise of the war power which was evident throughout the Vietnam War, the air war in Yugoslavia and the first and second Gulf Wars.

The book also contains edited versions of the key court decisions in *New York Times v. US*, *Korematsu v. US*, *Youngstown Steel*, *Bissonette v. Haig*, *Ex parte Milligan*, *Verdugo-Urquidez*, *US v. Yousef*, *Curtis Wright Exporting*, *Massachusetts v. Laird*, *Dellums v. Bush*, *Campbell v. Clinton*, *In Re Sealed Case*, *Hamdi v. Rumsfeld* and many other recently decided cases. These are followed by explanatory notes discussing their connection to other cases and statutes and their relevance to the ongoing development of national security law in the United States.

An important work in the field, Professor Sievert's new edition belongs on the shelf of all research libraries!
