Considered by many to be a flamboyant radical, William M. Kunstler defended many controversial clients, including **Jack Ruby, Abbie Hoffman, and the “Chicago Seven”**. Throughout his career Kunstler believed that “the fixed preconceptions of the community” can, in too many instances, contribute more to the outcome of criminal trials than the quantity or quality of the evidence. The emphasis on due process of law as the basic guarantee of our liberties, so often voiced by courts and lawyers, and reasonably true in ordinary trials, is secondary where prejudice prevails.

In this work, Kunstler explores 10 criminal trials, including the cases of Mary Surratt, Alger Hiss, the Rosenbergs, and Sacco and Vanzetti, illuminating for the reader the overwhelming influence of societal attitudes working against the defendants in each case within a particular point in history.

Inasmuch as our legal system wishes to preserve the ideal of “*innocent until proven guilty*”, Kunstler provides a sound argument for the unfortunate effect of society’s perception on the outcome of many of the most famous criminal trials in history. Kunstler’s work would be a welcome addition to any Trials collection.
